Care Circles - A new twist on a very old thing.

In a time when the world seems so chaotic, any one of us can begin to think, no one cares about me; I'm not appreciated. As we try to manage ourselves in our personal life and balance that with everything going on around us and in the world, it can be overwhelming. Evil, if you believe in such a thing, creeps into these small fractures and pushes people apart, exacerbating an already difficult situation. To counteract this, I invite us to engage in a simple task – pray for each other – by name. I know, I know... You want us to add yet another thing to this craziness?! Yes. We care because God first cared for us. By taking 60 sec/day to lift each other to God in prayer, we care for ourselves while we care for others. By the Holy Spirit, we are nourished through this simple act of praying for another. By caring, we diminish the power of evil to separate and divide. To accomplish this, we are forming Care Circles.

A Care Circle is a random group of church members and friends who will pray for each other. The Care and Visitation Team will create these Circles by using our current list of members and friends, keeping family units together. If you wish to be in a different Circle than your partner/spouse/parent/children, please let the church office know. Near the end of May, you will receive a list of folks who are in your Care Circle. (If you do not receive a list by May 26, please contact the church office. No one will be left out intentionally but with all our changes this past year some names and emails might slip through the cracks.)

To kick off this venture, a Care Circle lunch is planned for Sunday, May 31st – more details to follow. This is an opportunity to meet the folks on your list and for us to talk about the ways we can pray. In conjunction with this venture, we would like to have a church directory out and available by that date. The directory will only be available to the people who are in the directory. We need two things from you to do that:

1. Permission to list you and your family in the directory to include: phone, email, mailing address and a picture. Please let the church office know what of your information we can include.
2. A picture of you and/or your family.

May the struggles of the world bring us together rather than pull us apart. Let's care to lift each other in prayer.

Investment Team Update

In March, the Investment Committee voted to invest \$250,000 from the church's investment portfolio into the Community First Fund of Common Capital. Common Capital is a non-profit community loan fund and Small Business Administration micro-lender located in Springfield. About 9 years ago, the Investment Committee made its first alternative investment in this fund, which is used to provide loans for small businesses in our region. Loans are made available to small, new and minority-owned businesses, typically businesses to which banks can not lend. As of June, 2023, Common Capital's loan portfolio totaled \$7.7 MM and loans were made to businesses owned by people with low-to-moderate income (47%); businesses owned by women (54%) and businesses owned by people of color (54%). The Investment Committee is pleased to soon have a total of \$800,000 invested in local alternative investments that positively affect individuals that live here in the 413.

Elected Core Ministry

The ECM met on April 14th. After hearing reports from various Teams, the ECM decided it would prefer to receive a report or minutes from all Teams to be read prior to the ECM meeting. This will allow more time for broader church issues to be discussed.

Items discussed as follow up from the Church retreat: a process for discussing the church name, the creation of both a Worship Team and a Stewardship Team, the timing for consideration of an additional ministerial position.

ECM's primary focus for the month of May is selecting and commissioning the Ministerial Search Committee.

Search Process

The Transition Team has completed the church profile and will make it available to church members soon. The Elected Core Ministry is currently forming the Search Team with an expected commissioning date of May 31st. The Search Team will then begin circulating the church profile by July 1. The Search Team will continue to receive ministerial profiles and conduct interviews until it has found the right candidate for this time in the life of this congregation. There is no predicting how long this will take. Thank you to everyone who has participated in helping the Transition Team to do its work. Please hold the Search Team in your prayers throughout the coming months.

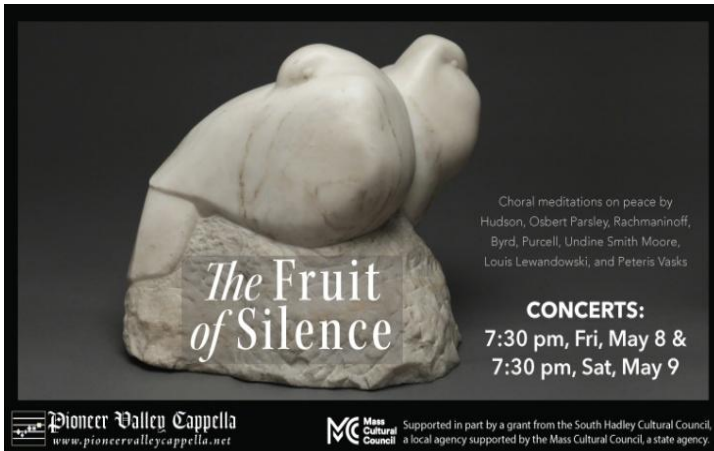
1. Sunday, May 3rd at 4:00 PM Boston Harmony
